

Course Title: Safety Committee's Role in Public Works

Course Duration: 2.0 Hours

Course Description: As an Oregon employer, we are required by Oregon OSHA to have a safety committee or hold regular safety meetings (Rule# 437-001-0765). We will discuss why they are needed, how to stay compliant and the responsibilities of the committee.
