Information about the Facility

The Corvallis Water Reclamation Facility has been serving the community since the 1950s, beginning with the implementation of primary treatment and disinfection. In the 1960s, trickling filters were added to enhance biological treatment, followed by the introduction of activated sludge secondary treatment in the 1970s.

Significant upgrades occurred in the early 2000s, including the integration of combined sewer overflow (CSO) treatment capabilities. Today, the facility can treat up to **24 million gallons per day (MGD)** through conventional secondary treatment and an additional **46 MGD** through the CSO treatment system, which includes primary treatment and disinfection.

The plant consistently achieves **removal efficiencies of up to 98%** for total suspended solids (TSS) and carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD), reflecting its commitment to high-quality water treatment and environmental stewardship.
