



Confined Space Entrant, Attendant, and Entry Supervisor Course Objectives and Target Audience

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Training Objectives: This seven-hour course will cover the following information: The Oregon Confined Space Standard OAR 437-002-0146, Characteristics of Confined Spaces, Hazards and Managing of Hazards, Duties and Responsibilities of Entrants, Attendants, and Entry Supervisors, The Use of Equipment, Care, and Maintenance Requirements, Rescue, and Personal Protective Equipment.

This course is designed and intended to serve as a solution to training needs, through in-class discussions and demonstrations, in the following areas:

- Define and understand the Oregon Confined Space Standard OAR 437-002-0146
- Understand the definition of a confined space and the potential hazards within a confined space
- Identify requirements for permit entry forms
- Understand roles and identify designated entrants, attendants, and entry supervisors of permit spaces
- Understand requirements for non-entry rescue, entry rescue, and third-party rescue
- Understand the basic functions of gas monitors, rescue equipment, harnesses, blowers, and fall protection

Target Audience: Public Works Maintenance workers, drinking water, wastewater, and collections; Public Works Directors, maintenance technicians of all grades, utility workers, equipment operators, street workers, supervisors, and laborers.
