

## Flagger Class Outline

Flagger training is an adult education model. Best practices would require at minimum, a model roadway, but showing it in the presentation is the most efficient way to go into that without that expense.

The goal is that flaggers, new and seasoned will come away with:

- a) The ability to know how to locate items pertaining to field work in the OTTCH
- b) Understand that their field set up should be according to the OTTCH
- c) Understand best practices

### Running the class/presentation

- Show the first Slide
- Present the Pretest (give them 15 minutes)
  - 10 questions
  - Review (5 minutes)
- Beginning portion of Slide Show
  - New Videos
    - 1 set up - discuss what's wrong. See Notes.
    - 2 news clip leading to discussion of safety
