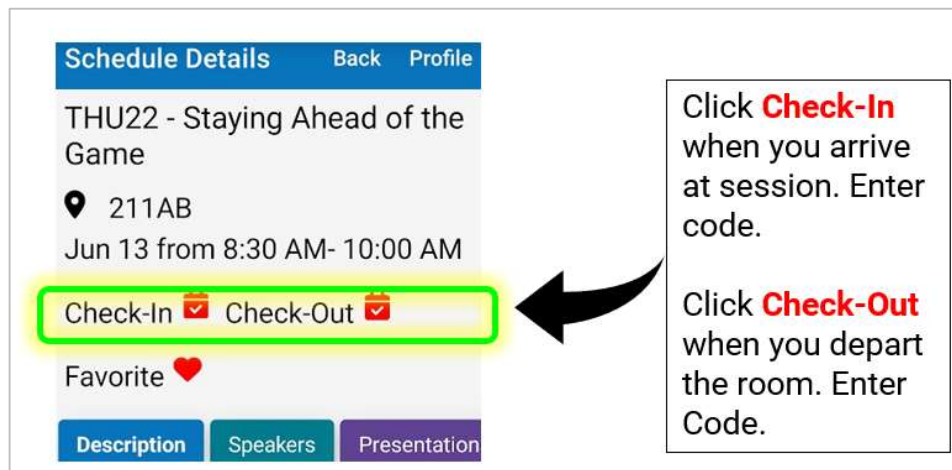
Session Attendance Tracking
