Real Estate Components & the Value of Water Rights



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Surface vs Groundwater Sales

- Size of the identifiable market
- Severance of use for transfer easier







Basics of Value: Water Rights Elements



- Source (surface or ground water)
- Beneficial Use
- Place of Use
- Point of Diversion or Appropriation
- Rate
- Volume/Duty
- Conditions

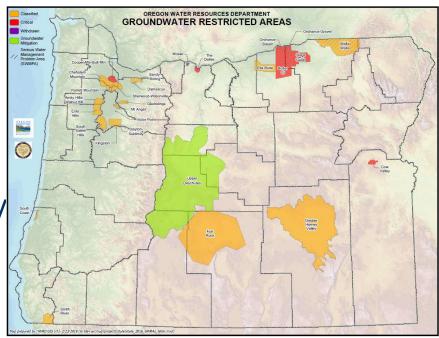


How Elements Related to Value

 Older priority dates – more valuable (limited "calls")

Larger POU, rate, & duty
 more valuable

 POU location – certain regions, more value





Abandonment & Forfeiture

- Forfeiture (Most States)
 - Presumption for nonuse for 5 years
 - Incorrect POU
 - Incorrect beneficial use

Abandonment

Intent to disregard a known right





"Legal" Value of Water Rights



Types of Recognized Water Uses

- Exempt Uses Low Value
 - No requirement to obtain state recognized water use
 - Exception: Development Rights
 - Subject to regulation
 - Not Severable
- Non-exempt Higher Value
 - Applications
 - Temporary Uses/Limited
 Licenses
 - Permits/Vested Claims
 - Decreed/Certificates/License





No-Low Value Water Use Authorizations

- Recent Priority Dates
- Residential spring uses
- Registration Statemen Certificate
 ON
 OF CLAMANT OF RIGHT TO APPROPRIATE GROUND WATER

 (Under Chapter 708, Oregon Laws 1955.)
- Exempt groundwater uses (in other than residential settings)
- Unregistered water right claims
- Rainwater collection systems
- Limited licenses

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Medium Value Water Use

- Permits
- Water use rights leased instream
- Water rights within a district



- Water rights subject to rotation agreement
- "Late" priority dates
- Registered water right claims (in unadjudicated basin)





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High Value Water Use

- "Early" priority date certificates
- Decreed water rights
- Water rights in "closed" basins
 - Basin plans
 - Water availability analysis

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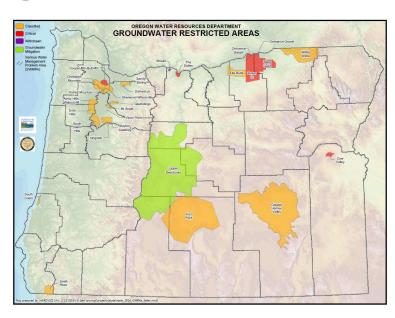
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"Closed" Basins: Oregon

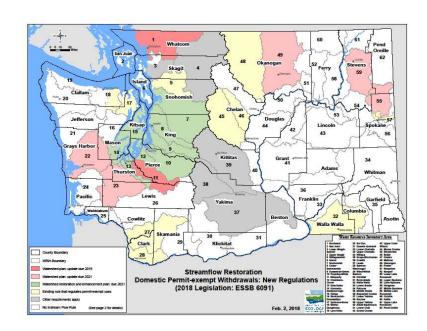

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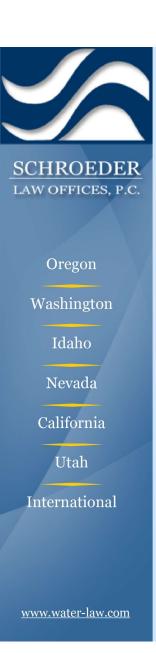


"Closed" Basins: Washington

- Hirst Decision (2016)
 - Growth Management Act
 required counties to
 limit growth to "available water resources"
- ESSB 6091 (2018)
 - Allows permit-exempt well development
 - Counties required to develop watershed plans & mitigate new development



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Valuation of Water Rights



Factors That Determine Value

- "Location-Location" (basin specific)
- Current infrastructure production capacity
- Growth management plans
- Demand & supply
- Individual circumstances





Information Used to Determine Value

- Similar sales
- Market information & demand projections
- Informal conversations a "reality check"
- Economic modeling

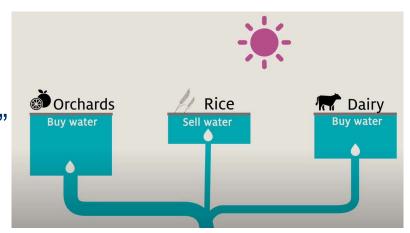

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Issues with Developing "Water Markets"

- Issues in western US/OR:
 - Water isn't "fungible" all water is different (location, quality, specific rules of use)
 - Transfer process & "red tape" slow process (often longer than irrigation season)
 - Public interest & environmental considerations (interbasin transfers?)





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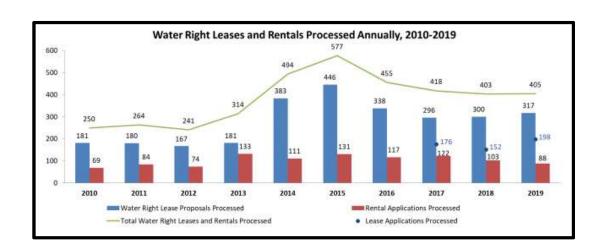
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Idaho Water Supply Bank

 - –Water Supply Bank







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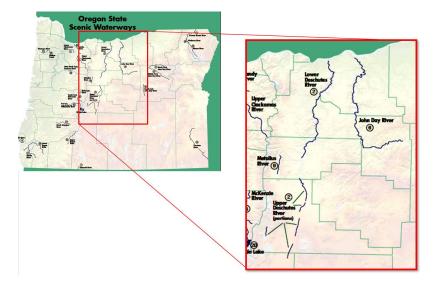
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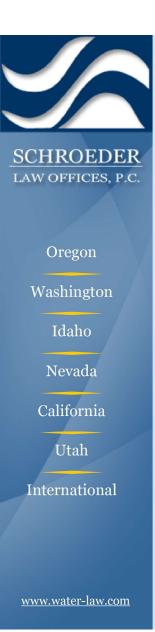
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Deschutes Groundwater Mitigation

- Scenic waterway limits upstream development
- Program allows development of new groundwater uses that might not otherwise be allowed due to hydraulic connectivity in area
- Surface water is fully appropriated in the area







Concurrency Laws & Development

 Requires developers to show a reliable water source prior to development

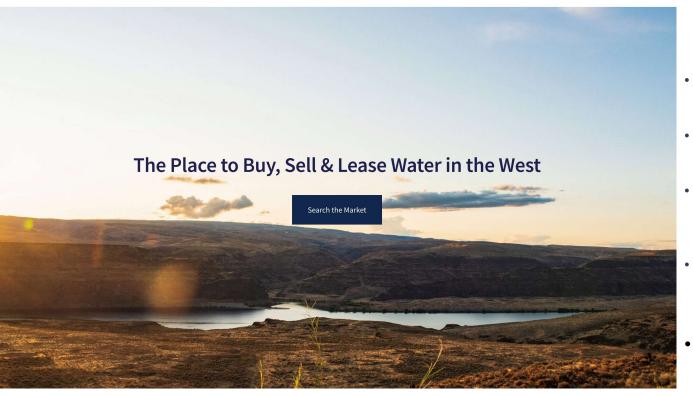

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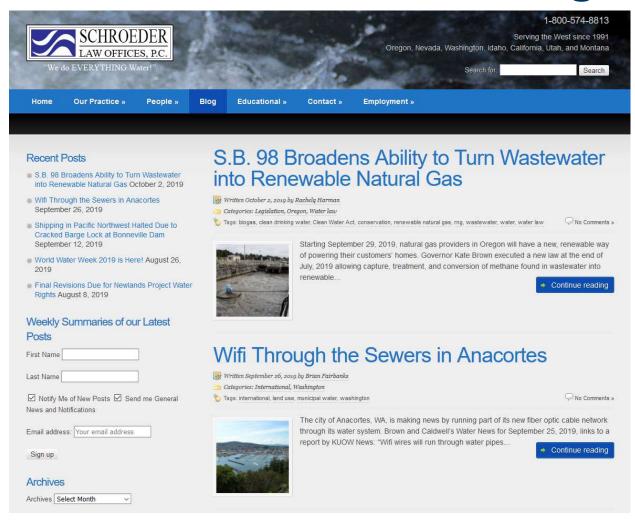
