Knowledge of how to perform basic control, containment, and/or confinement operations and rescue injured or contaminated persons within the capabilities of the resources and PPE available with their unit. 29 CFR, Part 1910.120(q)(6)(ii)(D)

Knowledge of how to implement basic equipment, victim, and rescue personnel decontamination procedures. 29 CFR, Part 1910.120(q)(6)(ii)(E)

An understanding of the relevant standard operating procedures and termination procedures. 29 CFR, Part 1910.120(q)(6)(ii)(F)
