Jeremy Peirsol joined RCAC in 2018. He conducts Technical, Managerial and Financial (TMF) assessments and rate analyses for water and wastewater utilities; assists utilities in the development of budgets and financial reports, and to achieve compliance with the Safe Drinking Water and Clean Water Acts; develops work plans to address system needs and provides training and technical assistance to build board capacity; promotes, facilitates and mediates community partnerships to maximize limited resources; and plans, prepares, and delivers group and one-on-one adult trainings and workshops to utility staff, boards, and community members. Under RCAC's Private Well program, Mr. Peirsol also educates homeowners on maintenance and testing of household wells.

Before joining RCAC, Mr. Peirsol was a Grants/Contracts Officer with the Idaho Department of Correction where he oversaw contracts, wrote grant proposals and professional service agreements, tracked budgets and ensured contractor compliance, analyzed report data, and built consensus on project development. Previously, as the Public Works Coordinator for the City of American Falls in Idaho, he coordinated the development, maintenance and review of the division's programs including the Capital Improvement Program.
